

So How Much Does it Cost ?



EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT

- ◆ Crèche equipment - €500 per crèche per year
- ◆ Child Care Teacher training – €40 per crèche volunteer

This will ensure the toddlers attending FII's 4 crèches are receiving a high standard of Early Childhood Development. It will also ensure the crèches are meeting the Department of Social Development standards so they can be registered and apply for ongoing funding from the South African government.



CAPACITY BUILDING & GOVERNANCE

- ◆ Governance Workshops - €500 per committee per year

Governance Training Workshops ensure the Community Based Organisations at each centre are equipped with the skills to manage the centre functions and the knowledge to register themselves as a Non Profit Organisation in South Africa. This is one of the means by which Friends in Ireland can create sustainable structures

NUTRITION

- ◆ Cost of feeding a child for a year - €60

This will provide each child attending Friends In Ireland centres with 2 nutritionally balanced meals a day – a hearty breakfast of porridge or brown bread and peanut butter as well as a substantial meal after school. FII currently feeds 450 children over 10 locations.

VOLUNTEER STIPENDS

- ◆ Stipend for a Drop In Feeding Centre Volunteer - €360 per year per volunteer
- ◆ Stipend for a Crèche Volunteer – €600 per year per volunteer

Friends In Ireland centres could not operate without the wonderful support of caring local volunteers who run the centres on a day to day basis. To show our appreciation to these wonderful people Friends In Ireland contribute a nominal monthly stipend to each volunteer.



AFTER SCHOOL SKILLS PROGRAMMES

- ◆ Literacy Programme - €500 per year
- ◆ After School's Study Programme – €400 per year
- ◆ Crafts Programme – €500 per year

In 2010, FII hope to commence an After Schools Skills Programme. FII will work with the Community Based Organisations to identify an appropriate programme based on the needs of the children in the area and the skills available in the Community.

SCHOOL WATER & SANITATION PROGRAMME

- ◆ Bore Hole - €13,000 per school
- ◆ Sanitation Facilities – €400 per cubicle

This will provide a whole school community with a clean water source and hygienic sanitation facilities, significantly reducing the number of days students are absent due to diseases related to poor water and sanitation. It will also provide safe drinking water, and a reliable source of water to maintain a school garden promoting food security.
